The All Star Reading Club started in 2008 at West Tualatin View Elementary School. Students from all grades are invited to read a book from a different genre each month and fill out the form on the back of this page. Every month, completed forms will be collected and a student's progress will be tracked on a chart.

Students who read books from **five** different genres will be invited to a Spring Party, choose a free book and receive prizes from the local community. Students who read a book from all **eight** genres will have extra time with the storyteller and a gift card to Powell's as well as attending the Spring Party, a free book and receive prizes from the local community.

Forms are due at the end of each month, make ups are allowed until the end of the following month. High quality reports will receive a free book.

December – Non-Fiction

A non-fiction book is one that is based on known true facts.

Books in this genre are most often organized using the Dewey Decimal System, a proprietary system of library classification developed by Melvil

Dewey in 1876. This system organizes books on library shelves in a specific and repeatable order that makes it easy to find any book and return it to its proper place. The system is used in 200,000 libraries in at least 135 countries.
