Every month, completed forms will be collected and a student's progress will be tracked on a chart.

Students who read books from **five** different genres will be invited to a Spring Party, choose a free book and receive prizes from the local community. Students who read a book from all **eight** genres will have extra time with the storyteller and a gift card to Powell's as well as attending the Spring Party, a free book and receive prizes from the local community.
